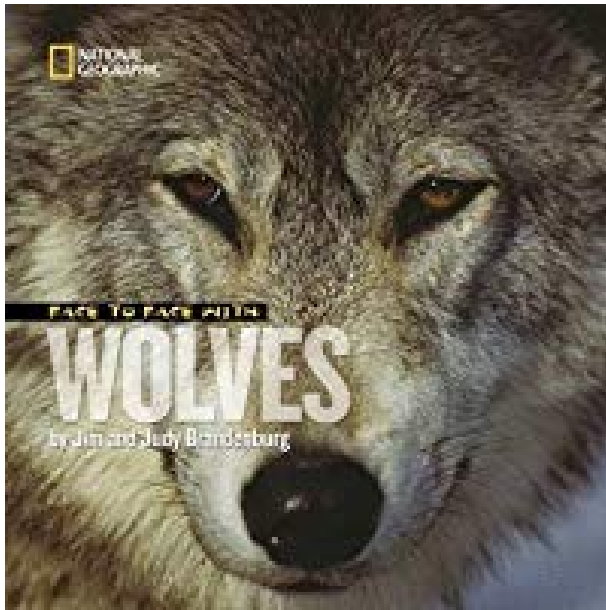


# Face to Face With Wolves
